## The Pastor's Message

You won't want to miss Galilee's special Christmas program on Sunday, December 12, starting at 4:00 PM. You will hear the vocal choir, the bell choir, and participate in singing Christmas carols, including one led by the children. Following the program in the sanctuary, you are invited to join in the meal that will follow. However, you must get in a reservation for the dinner so that we will know how much food to prepare.

The theme of this year's Christmas program is "He Came Down." Truly, this theme expresses very well what Christmas is all about. Starting the first Sunday in Advent, we enter a new church year, which will feature the Gospel of Matthew for the Gospel Reading for each Sunday. Matthew's Gospel bears the message that He (God) Came Down (from heaven) and now dwells with us. Even before they were married, Joseph was told by an angel in a dream that Mary, the young woman to whom he was betrothed, was bearing a child conceived by the Holy Spirit. This child would be a son who would be for the people

Immanuel, which means "God is with us" (Matt. 1:23). Later on Jesus underscored this point when he said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (18:20). And then after his crucifixion and resurrection, he told his disciples, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Not only did the Son of God come down for his birth, which we celebrate at

Christmas, but he continues to abide with us even to this day.

We are also giving special attention to prayer much of this year. Keeping Matthew's theme of God With Us in mind, how have you experienced the presence of God in your prayer life? My prayer for you is that you are

blessed with those prayer times when you simply grow in deeper appreciation of the faithful and loving presence of God in that moment.

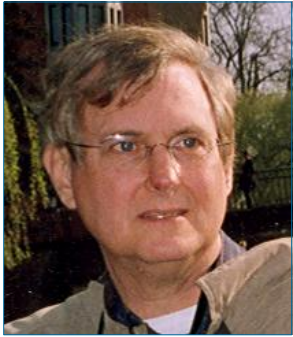

## Prayer is a Way of Living - Focus on Giving Thanks

A wise pastor told me years ago that giving thanks is the heart of spirituality. If prayer is a way of living, and I think that it is, then how can we be thankful on more than Thanksgiving Day, or more than at our regular times for prayer? In other words, how can we have a thankful heart every minute of every hour of every day of our lives?

We, therefore, start with how God has helped us in the past. God told Israel over and over to "Remember how the Lord God brought you out of bondage in Egypt." It is as we remember the past saving acts of God that we gain greater trust in God's power and love. And so Jesus says of Holy Communion "Do this in memory of me." Furthermore, let us reflect on how God has been present and active in our lives, blessing us beyond our expectations. As Martin Luther wrote in the *Small Catechism*, "God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all property—along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil."

When we are caught up in our stress, pain and suffering, it is easy to forget how God has helped us in the past. The trials of life can cause us to lose perspective and weaken our sense of trust in God's caring presence. But as we remember how God has helped us in the past we can be filled with hope for today and tomorrow. The hymn writer so beautifully expressed this idea by paraphrasing Psalm 90: "O God our help in ages past, our hope for years to come."

**Here is an idea to enrich your prayer life.** Mt. Carmel Ministries suggests using the letters **T.R.I.P.**© to help us in our praying.

- T.** = Thanks. For what am I thankful today?
- R.** = Regret or repent. For what do I need to repent of today?
- I.** = Intercession. For whom am I led to pray for today?
- P.** = Plan or purpose. What plan of action am I led to take today?

### Youth Update

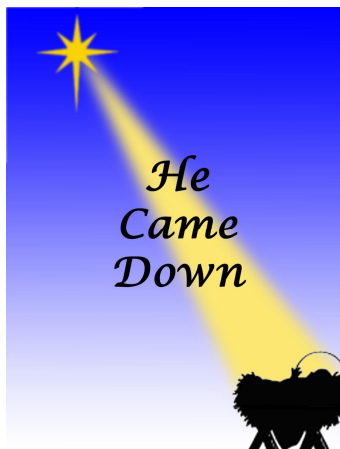

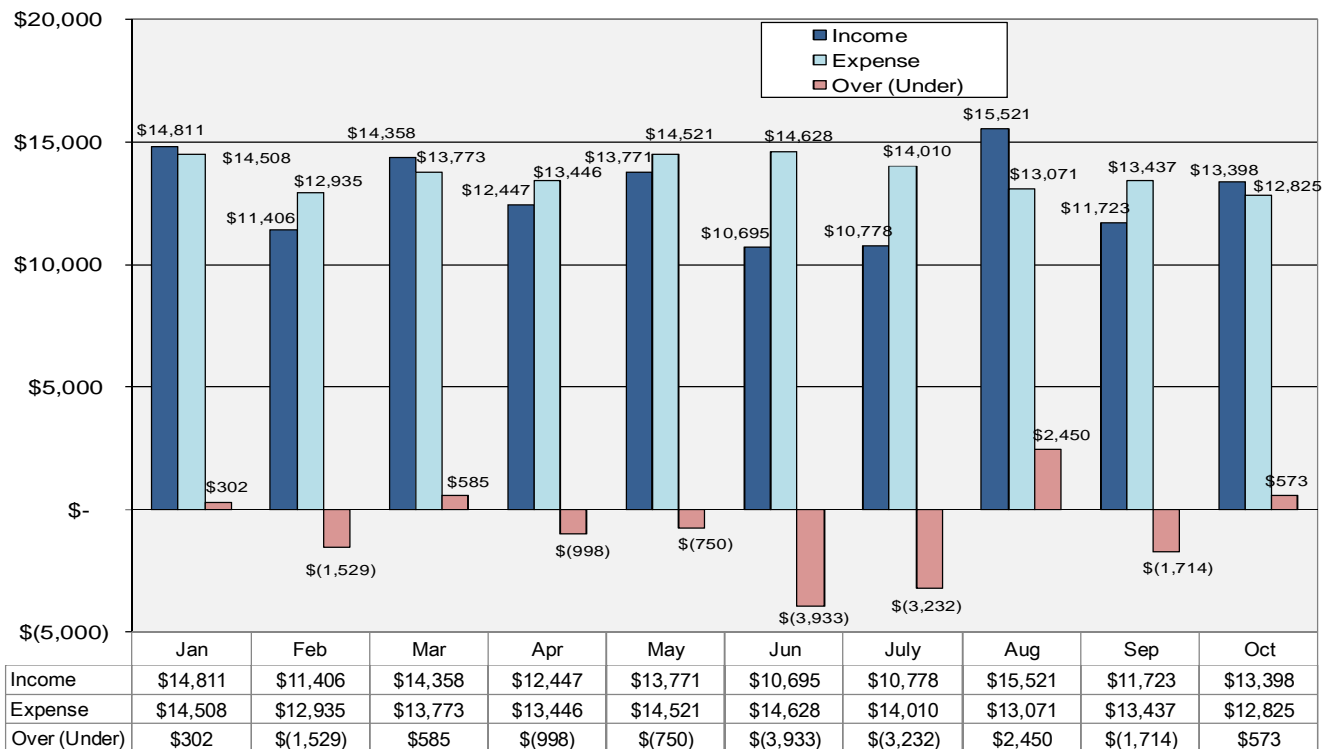

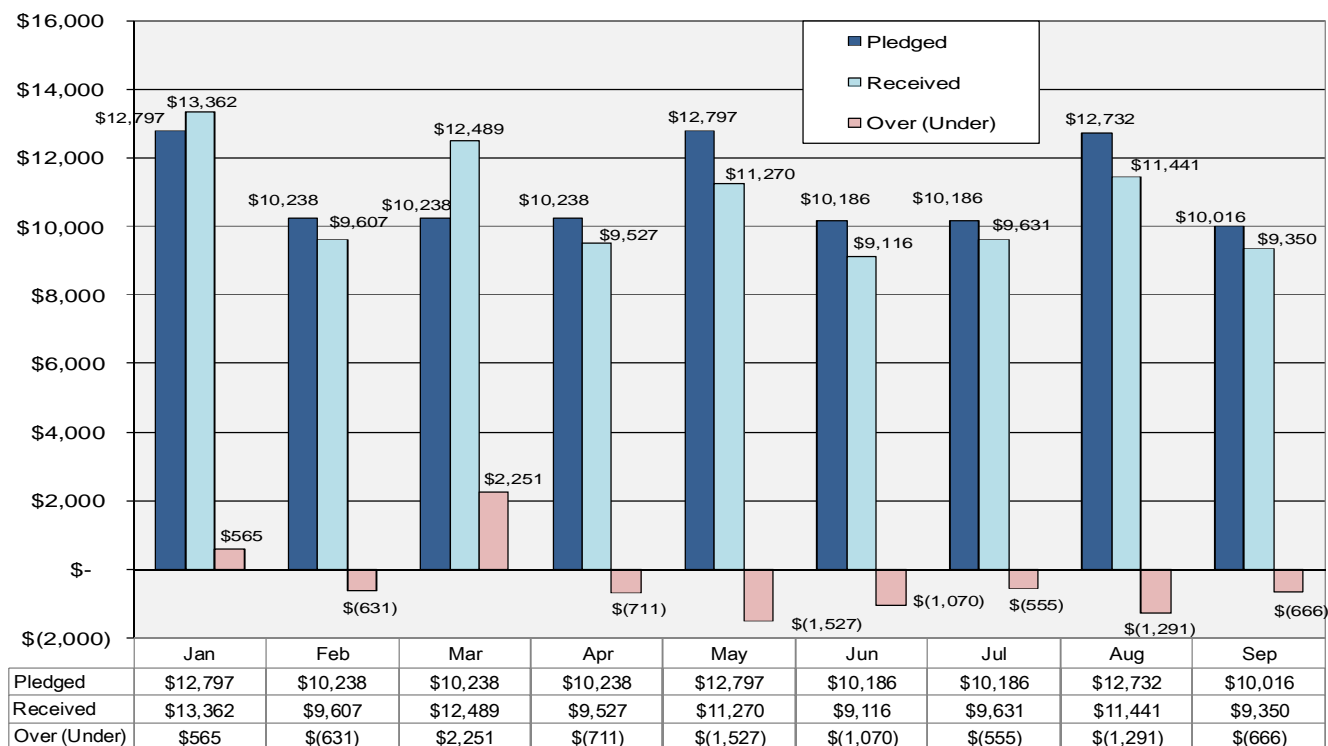
